REQUIRED MINIMUM DISTRIBUTION: For donors of a certain age, each year you can instruct your IRA administrator to transfer all or part of your required minimum distribution (up to \$100,000) directly to the Los Angeles County Animal Care Foundation (EIN 95-3909782) and avoid paying the tax had you taken it as income. A charitable IRA rollover makes it easier to use IRA assets, during your lifetime, to make charitable gifts. You can use tax-free IRA rollovers to make any kind of outright gift, including to support the ongoing work of the Foundation such as adoption and medical support.

DONOR ADVISED FUNDS: An increasingly popular method of charitable giving, a donor-advised fund (DAF) can be an easy and flexible way to manage your giving and help you achieve your strategic philanthropic goals. A donor-advised fund, or DAF, is like a charitable investment account for the sole purpose of supporting charitable organizations you care about, including the Los Angeles Animal Care Foundation (EIN 95-3909782).
