wellness exams to vaccinations, flea and

tick medications, and free pet food and supplies, these clinics provide vital support to those who may otherwise struggle to afford these services. By bringing services directly to our communities, we also help reduce barriers for those without easy access to transportation for their pets.

It all began when an Australian Cattle Dog (commonly called a "Heeler") named Gordo was surrendered to the Lancaster Animal Care Center—one of Los Angeles County's seven animal care facilities—because his previous owner had to move and his new residence did not allow dogs.

Mark Balentine, a devoted Heeler enthusiast from Georgia, caught wind of Gordo and began to do his research. Mr. Balentine wasn't just a normal pet owner looking to add another member to his pack, but a man with over sixty years of experience specifically with Heeler dogs. Despite being separated by miles of land, Mr. Balentine's determination to add Gordo to his Heeler family knew no bounds.

With the support of the Lancaster Animal Care Center team, Mr. Balentine embarked on a mission to bring Gordo home. From coordinating veterinary appointments required for interstate travel to navigating flight cancellations due to bad weather, every step was taken to facilitate Gordo's safe journey to his forever home. Finally,

after a whirlwind of logistics and travel, Gordo flew to Miami, Florida, to meet Mr. Balentine at his winter home.

Despite the long journey, Gordo's spirit remained unbroken, and he was eager to meet his new family. Joined by his fellow Heeler siblings, Gordo seamlessly integrated into the Balentine family. His boundless love swiftly endeared him to Mrs. Balentine, now faithfully watching over her like a loyal service dog.

But this heartwarming tale doesn't end there. It's a testament to the incredible efforts of individuals like Mr. Balentine and the dedicated team at the Lancaster Animal Care Center, who work tirelessly to ensure animals like Gordo find their happily ever after.

DIRECTOR'S LETTER

Stories like Gordo's exemplify the profound impact of partnerships and collaborations with other organizations in our shared goal of finding loving homes for as many animals as possible. However, despite our best efforts, budget and staffing limitations sometimes hinder our ability to provide the same opportunities for all potentially adoptable animals as we did for Gordo.

Your unwavering support is invaluable to the animals in our care centers and the dedicated staff and volunteers who tend to them daily. It enables us to sustain and implement programs that extend beyond basic animal care. These initiatives include intensified efforts to promote adoptable animals, reduced adoption fees, and providing resources to pet owners to prevent them from surrendering their pets. For instance, we were able to provide 2,066 Care Vouchers to pet owners in 2023, which were redeemed for crucial veterinary services. Without the availability of these vouchers, many pet owners would have no other option but to surrender their pets to a care center, resulting in a devastating experience for both the pet and its family. Our Care Voucher program is one of many initiatives made possible thanks to your support.

Our mission for this year remains steadfast: to help as many animals as possible by focusing on intake diversion programs and maximizing adoptions. We are excited about the new ideas we aim to introduce, such as my dream project of hiring a full-time groomer at



one of our care centers! This pilot project would show the positive impact this position would bring and ensure that our animals look their best, thus improving their chances of finding forever homes. However, the success of these programs hinges entirely on your generous support.

On behalf of the Los Angeles County Animal Care Foundation and the Los Angeles County Department of Animal Care and Control, I extend my heartfelt gratitude to you for championing the welfare of animals in our communities. You are the driving force behind our ability to sustain existing programs and introduce innovative, life-saving initiatives.


TOP NEEDS
