





MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

As I reflect on this past year, I am filled with both gratitude and a strong sense of purpose. Despite a challenging financial landscape, your support has helped us continue doing what matters most—providing safe shelter, lifesaving care, and compassionate service to the animals and pet owners who rely on us.

When wildfires tore through Southern California in January, we responded quickly to help families and their animals. Our teams provided emergency shelter to 482 displaced animals, and I'm proud to share that 414 have already been reunited with their families. The remaining animals, many of them livestock, are still in our care while their owners work to rebuild. These efforts would not have been possible without you.

We are also seeing more and more pet owners struggling to keep their animals

due to the rising cost of living. Thanks to the Los Angeles County Animal Care Foundation and our generous donors, we have been able to expand access to free wellness services through Vet@ThePark, provide spay and neuter assistance, and distribute Care Vouchers to help with urgent needs like veterinary care and grooming.

Every time I visit our care centers, I am reminded of what your support makes possible. I see shy kittens who finally relax in the arms of a foster caregiver. I see older dogs getting their first bath in months. I see pet owners holding back tears when we tell them we can help.

You are part of each of these moments. Your kindness is what allows us to show up for animals, no matter the size of the challenge.

Thank you for standing with us, believing in our mission, and helping us build a more compassionate community for animals and the people who love them.

FROM STRAY TO STAR: ECLIPSE'S JOURNEY TO A FOREVER HOME

When a tiny kitten was found wandering alone on a school campus in late May, no one knew how much her life was about to change. On May 29, 2025, Eclipse arrived at the Palmdale Animal Care Center. Just nine weeks old, she was underweight, matted, and struggling. She had clearly been surviving on her own for far too long.

Thankfully, Eclipse was immediately enrolled in our **Dreams Come True** program—a donor-supported fund that provides advanced medical care, specialized grooming, and other services that go beyond standard care center resources. Through this program, Eclipse received the veterinary care and attention she needed to treat dehydration, eye discharge, and malnourishment.

Her transformation was remarkable. With each passing day, Eclipse's personality began to shine through—curious, affectionate, and full of life. Her before-and-after photos tell the story better than words ever could.

Just a little over a week later, on June 6, Eclipse found her forever family. She went from being a frightened, fragile stray to a beloved companion in a home where she is now cherished and safe.

NEW PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT: HOMEBOY INDUSTRIES GROOMING

We are proud to announce a new partnership with Homeboy Industries, the largest gang rehabilitation and reentry program in the nation. Founded more than 30 years ago by Father Gregory Boyle in Los Angeles, Homeboy Industries provides hope, job training, and support to individuals who have been involved in the justice system or are seeking to leave gang life behind. The organization helps people rebuild their lives through employment opportunities, therapy, education, and skill development in a supportive community.

Thanks to donor support, Homeboy Industries now brings its newest workforce training program—Puppy Fades—to our Downey Animal Care Center once a week. Under the guidance of a professional instructor, participants learn hands-on grooming skills by providing full grooming services to animals in our care.

The program is a win for everyone. Animals receive high-quality grooming, improving their health and adoptability. Participants gain real-world experience and job-ready skills in animal care, creating a new path forward in their personal and professional lives.

This partnership complements our two full-time grooming programs already operating at our North and South Animal Care Centers—also made possible by generous grants and donor funding.

WILDFIRE UPDATE: SUPPORTING ANIMALS IN CRISIS

When devastating wildfires swept through Southern California in January, the Los Angeles County Department of Animal Care and Control mobilized immediately to provide emergency transportation and care to displaced animals. Thanks to your support, we were able to respond swiftly and compassionately.

In total, **482 animals**—from dogs and cats to horses and goats—were evacuated and cared for by DACC staff and volunteers. We're proud to share that **414 of those animals have already been reunited with their families**, bringing comfort and healing in the aftermath of chaos.

For the animals still in our care, many of whom are livestock, the journey continues. Their families are working hard to rebuild homes, fencing, and access to basic resources. In the meantime, we remain committed to providing safe housing, daily care, and medical oversight for each one of them.

Your donations allowed us to provide hay, sheltering supplies, food, and medical attention at a moment's notice. **Thank you** for being there when the animals needed you most.
